As District Superintendent of the Washington Pacific District, it is my honor to report to this 76th Assembly and share my 8th report. Looking in the rearview mirror at the last year, much has happened on our district that gives us cause for encouragement and celebration at this annual gathering. I was encouraged by the number of pastors who participated in the recent gathering of Nazarene leaders at M19 (Mission 2019) at the Kansas City Convention Center. The theme of the event was evangelism and we spent our time investigating the most effective ways of engaging our culture with the gospel. I left the event feeling good about our current church and hopeful about the future. It was so good to see several young pastors from our district at this important conference. Some of them were leading workshops and others were engaged in thoughtful conversation about how we can most effectively minister in the communities where we serve. We have so many good and effective leaders.

Providing leadership and ministry opportunities for developing leaders is something we value and make a priority on our district. I'm grateful for pastors with years of experience in ministry who are willing to share what they've learned with those who are just beginning. We are blessed with men and women who are faithful servants of Jesus; some just starting the race, some running with endurance and others finishing the course. So much ministry – so well done.

For several years we have been developing and improving our clear and supportive path for Ministers in Training. We were humbled to be chosen to share a workshop at M19 outlining the good work of our Board of Ministry. At this year's Assembly, we'll see a harvest of some of the good fruit of this investment as we ordain 9 Elders, men and women who have answered the call of God to lead the church and are fulfilling that call on the Washington Pacific District. It is our pleasure to have walked with them to this important and sacred milestone. Identifying and preparing God's people to lead the church is among the highest of our priorities. One of the ways we can measure the effectiveness of our local ministries is an unbroken line of people responding to the call of God to give their lives in service to Jesus. Sometimes this call results in leading the church in a pastoral assignment; sometimes the outcome is a lay leader teaching, administering or caring. In every case, the result is all of us living so that around us things on earth have the priorities of heaven.

While much of my day-to-day work is done in support of local pastors, both lead and associates, I am also very involved with lay leaders as I interact with members of congregations in worship services, board meetings and on selection committees when churches are in leadership transition. I have found in every church, godly lay leaders who care deeply about the health of their local congregation and want to see their church be effective for Jesus in the context where they serve. I am grateful to God for these good women and men who are using the strength of their lives to share Christ through our local churches. I have sometimes wondered if we have been guilty making too much distinction between the ministry of clergy and laity. It has always been the scriptural intention that we share freely of the gifts God has given and that each of us be prepared to use what we have in service to the good news about Jesus.

Along with the denominational focus on evangelism at M19, we've been concentrating on it as well. Every lead pastor received the book, <u>Organic Outreach for Local Churches</u>, and that was the topic of our Pastor's Training Day. I have been involved in stimulating conversations ever since our January meeting. Although there was a mixture of opinions about the presentation, the question remains, "What is our plan locally and personally for doing what Jesus asked us to do?" We are continuing the conversation at this Assembly and encouraging all of us to *preach the gospel – baptize new believers and to not forget about making disciples.* While training and technique have value, the truth is that we will never be effective in our efforts at evangelism unless it is the love of Jesus that

moves us. As Paul reminds the Corinthians, "It is the Love of Christ that compels us...all this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation...We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us." Building the brand or influence of our local church is a very poor substitute for the "ministry of reconciliation" that Christ has given us to do. It has been a joy to watch the Gig Harbor and Lakewood New Hope churches haul a portable baptistry back and forth as they celebrate old things becoming new in the lives of people they are reaching for Jesus.

This year, our pastors have reported that our local churches baptized 336 new believers. This is good news. While there has been a great deal of discussion about the appropriate metrics for measuring success in local church ministry, there can be no debate that people publicly declaring their faith in Jesus through baptism is one of them. If people being baptized is an outcome of a healthy church, what does it indicate? There may be several good answers to this question, but one thing is sure, through the lives and ministries of these local churches, there is a connection being made in the community. There may have been a day when we could sit inside the walls of our fellowship and wait for people to walk through the front door and into the waters of baptism - this is not our current reality. If it has been a few months or in some cases, years since the ministry of your local church celebrated someone's new life in Jesus through baptism, it is a cause for soul searching. As I write this, I recognize that one response to the last sentence could be guilt or even shame. These strong emotions can be motivating, like the jolt of a caffeine loaded energy drink, but the long-term effects are also the same - high blood pressure, heart palpitations, anxiety and panic attacks. It is not, however, a bad thing for us to confess our discouragement or apathy and be moved to a place of desperation that motivates us to pray. It is my prayer Oh Lord, that you would fill us with your presence and the joy of our salvation. Unless this is true of us, there will be no strength and peace in our own lives, much less abundance, to offer others. Let us not be consumed by the building or development of our reputation, organization or brand and mistake our agenda for yours. Help us to influence people for Jesus and see their lives buried with Christ in baptism and risen to walk a new life, Amen.

My Journey to pastoral ministry in the Church of the Nazarene began in earnest 46 years ago as a freshman religion major. I believed then that building the Church of the Nazarene and building the Kingdom of God were one and the same. Now I know they can be - they should be. I also believed that success in the church and therefore in Kingdom development and ministry were measured by how many attended. When the conversation at the pastors gathering turned to, "How large is your congregation?" as it almost always did, I knew that the question was really, "Mirror, mirror on the wall" sometimes I felt like Snow White, but more often I just felt Sleepy or Grumpy. One of the good things about equating congregational success to worship attendance is that every church has a primary worship gathering where a count can be taken. Accountability is essential to the healthy development of...well anything. Another plus to this metric is that I can't imagine a church that doesn't gather for corporate worship. The bad thing about worship attendance being equated with success is that we know by experience and observation that just because something is well attended doesn't mean people are becoming what Jesus had in mind for us to be. If all the energy of the ministry is focused on attendance at worship, the emphasis on making Christ-like disciples can easily take a backseat or even be absent altogether. There are a few churches on our district where doing the right thing has resulted in a decline in attendance. I believe pastors and lay leaders should bravely be obedient to the leading of the Spirit and sometimes lead in unpopular directions. It is also possible to point to places where pastors and local churches are drawing people and seeing success in the way that we have traditionally counted it and assume they are shallow. This too is a mistake. Let's commit to prayerfully offering to the Lord the most meaningful worship experience we can, seek the Lord wholeheartedly and love one another deeply from the heart. I know it's an older song, but the second verse of "Touch Your People Once Again" resonates with my soul as I think about our churches, *"Touch your people once again with your precious holy hand, we pray. Let your Kingdom shine upon this earth, through a living glorious church. Not for temporary deeds but to restore authority and power. Let a mighty rushing wind blow in. Touch your people once again."*

Jesus asked us to "go" and with no intention of disobedience, we have switched it to "come." We announce the time we gather on our webpage, Facebook page and on the signs and doors outside our churches. If we look at the results of our efforts and recognize that we often aren't getting the outcome we were hoping for, maybe it is time for us to "go." Go, not with the intention of filling the seats on Sunday, but with a desire to meet people where they are and bring the presence of Jesus into the everyday circumstances of life. At this year's Assembly we've given every Missional Zone the opportunity to share one church's story of partnership where the love of Jesus is being shared intentionally outside the walls of the local church. The Total Missional Impact of the local church has always been more than worship attendance. One important metric for a heathy church is a clear and defined way of going and engaging with people we have not befriended yet. In gatherings of pastors in missional zones around the district, I shared the little book by Michael Frost, Surprise the World - The Five Habits of Highly Missional People. It was encouraging to see several pastors take the simple principles in the book and build an effective topical preaching series around the themes. These five biblically based principles, which are really just the spiritual disciplines (Generosity, Hospitality, Spirit-Led, Christlike, and living a Missional lifestyle) are habits that work in a place like western Washington - if practiced, would revive our local churches. Let's invite people to church, but more importantly, let's go and "Surprise the World" by living the way of Jesus.

Paul writing to the Ephesians, reminds them that Christ is the head and the church is his body. The healthy, local church is essential to the mission. We believe that it is through the local church that the bulk of ministry is accomplished, and yet, it is a shortsighted local church that is not connected to a mission greater than its own. In Debra Voelker's report from Nazarene Missions International, you will hear the wonderful ways we are connected around the world. In the report from Megan Wighaman, our Nazarene Youth International President, you will hear about the students whose lives have been impacted by summer camp, mission and leadership opportunities, like Nazarene Youth Conference, and a growing connection with Northwest Nazarene University. James Matthews and our discipleship team have added thought and strength to this Assembly as well as provided for camping and other ministries like Bible Quizzing for our children. Our relationships are deep, and our connections are strong.

One of the noteworthy ways our ministries have been strengthened this year, is the restart of the work in Maple Valley. This revitalized church celebrated its one-year anniversary at the end of March. We are grateful to pastors Scott Fox and Cory Daker as The Rescue Church relaunched our work in this growing community. An additional cause for celebration is the replanting of our congregation in Bellingham. Pastor Ryan and Bohdana Fasani and their 4 children moved to Bellingham in the early fall to build relationships, develop a core team and share the dream of a new work, tailormade to reach the population of this unique western Washington city. You'll have opportunity to meet Pastor Ryan and hear a bit of his dream at this year's Assembly. The Church of the Nazarene first planted a congregation in Bellingham in 1911. It is good to be back in this significant city with leadership and a vision for establishing a faith community that fits this college town and culture.

This year we have been working on some significant restarts and retooling of some of our church plants. Just last Sunday, it was my privilege to install Sheryl Ice as the pastor of South Hill Encounter, a church plant parented by Pastor Chris Wighaman and the Bethel Church in 2016. We are praying

for this young church as they take steps to secure their future ministry. As we look to this next year, we are hoping that God is laying it on the hearts of pastors and church boards to dream of a place where the gospel in not yet and plant a new work there. I attended a conference this year where the workshop leader asked us if we knew the purpose of an aircraft carrier. We said, "To launch airplanes." "Almost," he said. "It is to forward launch airplanes and take the battle where the carrier cannot go." Then he said, "What do you call an aircraft carrier that doesn't launch airplanes?" We just blankly stared at him and he said, "A cruise ship." Let's make sure our churches are fulfilling their purpose and launching ministries beyond the reach of our current influence and make sure the trip isn't all about our personal preferences and comfort. Let's decide to go.

The KOMO News Special, *Seattle is Dying* caught national attention in March when it documented the complexity of addressing the issues in our district's largest city. Homelessness, mental illness and drug addiction were the focus of the report. We are committed to finding a way to be a part of a Christ honoring spiritual solution to the puzzle that we find in the city. Paul Johnson has been coordinating our Seattle City Project and 5 of our churches have been meeting together most very week for over two years. Developing a strategy for the city that moves our mission forward has been slower than we hoped. The cost of housing alone keeps most young families out of the urban core. Bringing mission minded people to join the effort runs into the same hurdle. This group is active and committed to long term engagement with the city and one another. Pastor Paul is convening the group and leading the plan for the restart of our church on Beacon Hill. The West Seattle Church and Pastor Shaun Mattson are in the first phase of the remodeling and renovation of our historic building near Alki Point. Things in the city are moving slowly, but they are moving in the right direction.

When the district functions at its best, local churches are resourced and supported in ways that make for a more dynamic impact. Nazarene Compassionate Alliance Northwest was created to connect, resource and train caring people in our local churches to respond to human need. We are busy imagining the next chapter of this ministry because the need is so great, resources are limited - caring and sharing can wear you out. NCA/NW is uniquely suited to address the issues of isolation and fatigue that frequently come with people who provide services to those in need. On May 4th leaders in compassionate ministries from the Washington Pacific District and Northwest District, which represents the eastern half of the state, will gather in Olympia to envision the next chapter of this ministry. We are combining our efforts for collaboration and settles on the east coast, we will be developing new leadership to continue the good work of compassion that needs our collective effort. We are strengthened by our network of skills and resources.

In 2017, NCA-Northwest and WaPac launched a new ministry at our Assembly. "Welcome Home" is designed to provide opportunities for people in our local churches to build friendships with new neighbors who are coming to the pacific northwest from all over the world. This ministry to refugees and immigrants was not intended to be controversial or a source of political division, but to recognize the fact that people from many places where we have prayerfully sent missionaries, are now living next door. It is unfortunate that the launch of our ministry coincided with a divisive national debate about immigration. While we leave it to the government to resolve issues that relate to our borders, we recognize that this atmosphere has created fear and discouragement for people who are our new neighbors. Our effort has a simple request, "expand your circle of friends by one; choose to make that person someone who is foreign-born." Dan Samuelson, who has a background with both World Vision and World Relief, is the director of Welcome Home and would love to talk with your church about a ministry to immigrants and refugees. In 2018, we moved Welcome Home to Tacoma First Church where Pastor Dan Samuelson is developing both the church and the outreach ministry

to refugees. He has a contagious love for people and is creating opportunity for compassion and evangelism in one of the oldest churches on the district. Dan would love to share and dream with your church about how to reach out with the love of Christ to friends you've not met yet. On Monday night at this year's Assembly we will recognize Pastor Dan Samuelson's ordination as he has chosen to use his leadership and calling in the Church of the Nazarene.

It is our desire to add more people to our district whose heart language is something other than English. We are grateful to have ministries in Spanish, Samoan, Mandarin, Cantonese, Tagalog, Korean and English. If we add all the languages of people who attend our Kent Hillside Church, we would include many more. The leaders of these ministries are a gift and blessing to WaPac. Rev. Taulima Oge, who directs our Samoan ministries, is hosting a denominational gathering for Samoan churches this summer, July 11-14. Our Puyallup Church will be the host church and we are anticipating a great gathering and an encouraging event. Rev. Ryan Foster is directing our ministry to congregations that worship in Spanish. In May, they are hosting a revival service with Rev. Felix Vargas from Colombia. Pastor Felix has a wonderful story of transformation from a life of drugs and violence to a man of peace and love. The meetings are scheduled for May 18th and we are expecting a time of blessing. We understand that we have some work to do in leadership development, but we have some great leaders who are taking positions of leadership on our district. At this year's Assembly, we will ordain Pastor Thomas Law, a pastor with an evangelist heart, who leads our Cantonese congregation in Kirkland.

I want to say thank you to those who have served the Lord by giving of their strength and time in positions of leadership and on boards and committees. I have found a likeminded and creative partner in Rev. Debra Voelker, our NMI President. She serves us so well and our district is honored by the fact that she is on the Executive Committee of Global Missions Council for the Church of the Nazarene. Megan Wighaman, our NYI President has been influential across the Northwest Field as an outstanding youth leader. Her investment in the lives of our youth and their leaders is making a real difference. James Matthews has developed a strong children's ministry team and is giving creative leadership to SDMI. I am especially grateful to the District Advisory Board for the support and guidance given to me as we've worked together to give good and thoughtful leadership to our district. Board Secretary, Ben Norris; Treasurer, Steve Walden; Lay leaders - Scott Cantrell, Debra Edgbert, Randy Freeby, Dick Halverson and Debbie Kuykendall, along with Elders - Craig Laughlin, Dave Ness, David Rodes, Ev Tustin and Tim Westerberg make up our District Advisory Board. I am particularly grateful for Sonya Edgbert who gives administrative assistance to all aspects of the organizational work of our district. She has several assignments and she manages them with patience, competence and good humor. She is a gift to WaPac.

For Sharon and me, this has been the most difficult year of our lives. The loss of our grandson, Micah, last March continues to be a source grief and heartache for us. We have been encouraged by your kindness, thoughts prayers and notes. The time of sabbatical provided by the Advisory Board during the summer came at just the right time for us to step away. We had a chance to rest, heal and spend time with our sons, their wives and hug our grandson, Declan – a bit more tightly than he was interested in. We love the work that God has given us to do on the Washington Pacific District and all the wonderful people we have the privilege to serve. There are so many opportunities ahead of us – Let's keep in step with the Spirit and see our God-given visions become a reality.

NAZARENE MISSIONS INTERNATIONAL (NMI) PRESIDENT

The Bible is an epic narrative of God's unfolding plan to redeem the world. Page after page, verse after verse, reveals His unstoppable mission to gather His people from every tribe and nation. This has been His plan from the beginning. It's His plan now, and it's the plan at the end. God, whose very nature is focused and purposeful, has invited people like us, gathered in churches like ours, to join Him in fulfilling His desire - that His people will be one.

Our participation in His invitation is a natural part of being His disciples, and it's evidence that the church is alive and well. Since the day of Pentecost, the mission of God has been an outward movement, beginning at home and then flowing out in ever-widening circles. Our journey in missions as individuals and as a church is about finding the threads that tie our story to His story, that connects our missions to His.

Seven years ago our District Superintendent suggested that we combine NMI convention and District Assembly, which had always been held separately. I looked him in the eye and said: "There is no way on earth that is ever going to happen." At least that is what I said in my mind. Audibly I think what came out of my mouth was "sure, whatever you need us to do."

But they do fit together beautifully because mission is not just a ministry of the church. It is the church. There is no church without missions. If we want to take His church where it is not yet, then our outreach needs to be holistic. We need to move seamlessly between local and global missions in our assembly, as well as in our local churches. This week we will hear reports from pastors and from the mission fields, intermingled and woven together to create an incredible tapestry of God's redemptive story to all the nations.

It's been said that being a holiness people - we have a cup of water in one hand, and the other hand is nailed to the cross. People often need to see the life of Jesus in action before they listen to His message. The church does not exist for itself but to proclaim and make known God's Kingdom to the world - through words and deeds. As you listen to the reports and watch the videos today and tomorrow, I hope you will see the beautiful tapestry we are building here in the Washington Pacific District. Our churches are taking the gospel to where it is not yet - in our neighborhoods and across the globe. The threads that are being woven together come through Puyallup's ministries in Malawi, Silver Creek in El Salvador, Kent's work among the refugees, Mt Vernon's connection to a local college, Centralia's help with victims of domestic violence and Kelso's partnership to fight human trafficking. There are so many more stories beginning along the I-5 corridor and moving out into the world. We are discovering what God is doing and are joining in. That is missions. That is the heart of God.

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8) It's a little word but such an important one. Jesus is calling us to the AND. We can't focus on reaching the unbelievers in our local communities and forget about the nations. Nor can we focus on building God's Kingdom there without building it here. We have a task that Jesus expects us to finish before He returns again. It entails taking the Gospel to all ethnicities around the globe. From the time of Abraham to Jesus, to Paul and through today, incredibly, God's preferred method to fulfill His mission has been to send His people on His behalf.

The English word for missions comes from the Latin *missio* meaning to send. The concept of *miso deio* - the mission of God - is recognition that God is a sending God and the church is a sent people. He is a missionary God in this culture, and in every culture. His nature does not change with location. Therefore, a missionary posture and mindset should be the normal expression of the

church in all times and in all place. The gospel has come to us and we have a responsibility to live out its implication where we are - in this culture, in this time and wherever He sends us. We are a sent people, sent by a sending God.

As a church body, we partner together - praying, equipping, supporting, and commissioning those that are sent.

This year, as a denomination:

- 501 Nazarene churches were organized. At least one church was planted every single day! The two fastest growing areas are Africa and Eurasia.
- 146,988 new Nazarenes are joining us in worshiping our Lord Jesus Christ
- 33.3% of Global Churches of the Nazarene gave 5.5% or more to World Evangelism,
- Collectively we gave \$37,709,138 USD to the World Evangelism Fund

The love and companionship of God and His people through history is truly a luminous story. A large part of the story is the story of missionaries - people sent out to meet God's people across a boundary that, but for the mission of God, would continue to be set apart and separate from those whom God calls to be one.

In 1980, the Church of the Nazarene commissioned 30 missionaries from 1 country. A few weeks ago we commissioned our largest group of Nazarene missionaries in 40 years. 37 new missionaries from 17 different countries! Only 40% of the group is from North America.

This past year the General Board of Superintendents, Global Missions, and NMI collaborated on the development of the Nazarene Missions Project that gives concise guidelines to recognize, nurture, and send missionaries from our churches and districts. We look forward to a district assembly in the future when we lay hands on and send more of our WaPac people out with the call of Christ on their lives.

We appreciate the fact that we are One body, One Church and that together we can reach around the world to change lives and transform hearts in Jesus' name. This past year WaPac District:

- Gave \$1,023,565 to the World Evangelism Fund
- 73% of our churches gave at least 5.5% of their income to the World Evangelism Fund
- Nearly \$87,000 in deputation, blessing the missionaries that bless us.
- \$84,834 was given to provide for the physical needs of those who are hurting.

Our children raised \$6,917.32 to provide a cup of cold water in Sri Lanka - actually more than a cup - a whole biologic water filtration system that turns dirty water into clean water. Proving life-giving water for years to come. This year they hope to do the same for Bangladesh.

We sent a team to Dominica to help with hurricane relief. They painted a church and built a house. They took 15,000 vegetable seeds, Bibles, hymnals, and Shoes that Grow - one hand holding a cup of water, the other nailed to the cross. This fall we are sending two teams, back-to-back to assist in establishing a new district and a permanent presence for the Church of the Nazarene in the northern area of Argentina.

While missions is in our DNA, that doesn't mean it is always second nature or comfortable. Teana Sunberg, Global Missionary for the Church of the Nazarene, says "it is a painful truth for us as global Christian communities that the missioning God whose name we carry, whose sanctuary we seek, and whose blessing we desire pushes us both spiritually and geographically into places where we would rather not go. Even more frightening is that He commands every believer to emulate His action of throwing open the door and welcoming the stranger to the table."

John Wesley went to the coal mines, not because that's where everyone was but it was where no one else was. Our people have served in prisons, in homeless camps, and among refugees. He is the God who is near to the poor, suffering and broken-hearted. I pray we won't be afraid to follow Him into the uncomfortable and dark places.

WaPac NMI is establishing two \$1,500 grants to help your church jump start compassionate response to the needs in your communities. The goal is to help support your church in its efforts to serve others and to help create change in your communities - changes that can point people towards Christ. The grants can be used to start a meal program, buy a projector and popcorn machine for outdoor movies at a local apartment complex, or anything that will help you minister to those around you. Take advantage of it. Step into the uncomfortable places and impact your neighborhood for Him.

We've been given the authority to go. We are expected to go. We can extend the domain of our King when we step out of our comfort zone and serve others. What we do is driven by transformation of who we are in Christ. He has changed us. He's made us different. He's made us servants. We live in a broken and shattered world that desperately needs Him. We are a long way from the actual Jerusalem, Judea, and Samaria but you and I are here today because the first believers took seriously His words to go into the entire world! May we also be a people who are faithful to accept His invitation.

The book of Revelation reveals that there will always be different nations, but in the end, there will only be one King!" May His glory, goodness, love, and grace burst into our lives so that we rise up to join Him in His mission to the world.

2. In the light of the remarkable success and blessing presently being enjoyed by many of our churches involved in the ministry of Faith Promise, as well as the increased funds available to the cause of world evangelism, we heartily recommend that each church give prayerful consideration to the establishment of Faith Promise giving.

3. We recommend that the churches struggling with their Funding the Mission goals confer with the district superintendent. With concern for local church health and commitment to operating district ministries as efficiently and as economically as possible, the District Assembly Finance Committee recommends that the District Advisory Board review annual church finance reports, and to visit with any church regarding the equanimity of its report.

4. That members of the local church receive, at the discretion of the district superintendent, regular communication regarding the total district program of Funding the Mission.

Insurance and Properties

5. That the pastor give special attention to filing (a) the nonprofit corporation registration with the Secretary of State by the last day of your anniversary month (the month in which your church was incorporated), and (b) the tax exemption forms for the church and parsonage properties with the State Department of Revenue by March 31. (Notices are sent to each church by the State of Washington.) That the deadline due dates be printed in pastors' letters. That each new pastor be notified by letter from the district superintendent regarding these requirements. Also, that the district office keep on file (a) the federal ID tax number, (b) state property tax exemption number, and (c) the Labor and Industries account ID number for each church.

6. That each local church carry liability and malpractice insurance and that Labor and Industries insurance, as required by law, be carried for every pastor and paid employee. That each year the local church evaluate the adequacy of its property insurance and, if necessary, adjust to current replacement costs.

Missional Vision

7. That the local church consider, at appropriate times, the support of the District Missional Vision through Funding the Mission and participation on assigned district Work and Witness projects. District mission's projects may count as 10% giving.

<u>Education</u>

8. That every church pay its Education Share in full. For the **2018-2019** school year, Northwest Nazarene University will match all local church scholarships of \$350 per year as follows:

9. That each church supports the training of Nazarene ministers and missionaries by taking special offerings on:

October 6, 2019 for Nazarene Bible College

January 19, 2020 for Nazarene Theological Seminary.

And further, promote the distribution of God's Word through an offering for the American Bible Society on **December 15, 2019.** These funds may be sent through the district office.

SDMI, NYI, and NMI Ministries

10. That the financial support of Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries, Nazarene Youth International and Nazarene Missions International be cared for through district Funding the Mission.
11. Since the district director of Sunday School & Discipleship Ministries, the district NMI president, and the district NYI president are not salaried positions, we recommend that churches using their services pay their expenses.

Ministerial Support

12. That each church support the pastor and family in prayer and have concern for their ministry, and that the pastor's leadership be recognized and followed; that the pastor's salary be a preferred claim on the local church and be reviewed annually. In salary reviews, local professional positions of like responsibility should be considered, taking into account education, tenure and preparation. Further, those other benefits, such as Social Security and adequate health insurance, be provided for both pastor and other staff members and that the local church reimburses their pastor for professional expenses (auto expenses and depreciation, entertainment, conferences, continuing education, etc.).

That each church supports its pastor and pastoral staff in the establishment of tax-sheltered annuities. (Complete information is available from the Board of Pensions & Benefits in Kansas City and at <u>www.pbusa.org</u>.)

13. That the local church board provide for reimbursement of expenses incurred by ministerial staff in attending necessary conventions, district functions, education workshops, etc. That each church be encouraged to provide continuing education for the pastor, including a library allowance where possible. That an amount be set aside regularly, in a separate fund, to send the pastor and spouse to the General Assembly.

- 14. That each church, and the district, encourage pastoral renewal for its pastoral family through:a. regular use of at least one day each week for rest and relaxation;
 - **b.** vacation time, given with full pay and with the church paying for pulpit supply, built around the pattern of:
 - (1) two weeks for pastors who have served the denomination up to five years;
 - (2) three weeks for pastors serving in the denomination from 6 to 15 years;
 - (3) four weeks for pastors serving in the denomination more than 15 years;
 - (4) Vacation is to be taken in the year earned unless prior approval is given by the church board.
 - **c.** provisions for study and education of at least one week per year, apart from normal church functions (district assembly, etc.), paid by the local church and subject to prior church board approval with a subsequent report to the church board;
 - **d.** camps, assemblies, conventions, etc. are considered as part of the pastor's responsibilities and not a portion of their vacation.

e. In order to encourage a healthy pastoral ministry and the lifelong learning of the pastor, the church board, in consultation with the district superintendent, should provide a sabbatical leave for the pastor during the seventh consecutive year of service in one congregation. It is strongly urged that the pastor's salary continue in full and that the church board provide for pulpit supply during the sabbatical period. (2017-2021 Manual 129.10).

15. That evangelists be compensated to provide an income adequate to cover the meeting being conducted, as well as consideration for interim periods of time lost due to travel and lags between meetings. In addition, all expenses incurred in holding a meeting (i.e. travel away from home costs) be provided.

16. We believe that adequately supporting ministerial personnel will help build the Kingdom and relieve personal pressures, thereby resulting in more effective leadership and direction. Therefore, it is recommended that a copy of this subsection be provided each church board secretary and read to each local church board early in the assembly year.

Planned Giving

17. That we encourage each church to invite a representative of the Church of the Nazarene Foundation for legacy giving resources.

18. That we adopt the giving plan adopted by the Board of General Superintendents and the General Board that asks each local church to give at least the following percentage of their income:

World Evangelism Fund	5.5%
Pensions & Benefits Share	2.25%
Education Share (NNU)	2.25%

19. That each church support the District Budget presented in paragraph No. 1 of this report. District (including NYI, SDMI & NMI) 3%

20. It is encouraged and expected that our churches participate in Funding the Mission of the Church of the Nazarene and that those who serve on district committees and boards will realize the responsibility of their influence.

Northwest Nazarene University strives to be a vibrant educational community that integrates and reflects Christian faith in all that it does. The University seeks to provide nationally-recognized programs distinguished by graduates who are academically prepared, spiritually grounded, service-minded, globally engaged, and vocationally successful.

STRATEGIC GOALS—The following 2017-2020 Strategic Plan has been recommended by President Joel Pearsall and approved by the NNU Board of Trustees. The plan includes the following themes and initiatives:

-That each local church supports NNU by making plans for 11th and 12th grade students to visit the NNU campus during one of the several Explore NNU days offered during the school year; having 9th to 12th grade students attend the regional event, *The Gathering*; taking advantage of Trustees Matching Scholarship. As a way of acknowledging the important contribution Nazarene churches make to NNU, the Trustees Matching Scholarship was initiated on behalf of students who come from our churches. This award is provided according to the following factor and criteria.
